Education council	Interprofessional	Provides oversight and guidance for educational activities including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an interprofessional residency program • competency development • conference planning
Healthcare experience council	Interprofessional	Responsible for fostering an environment that promotes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • professional behavior • employee engagement • a positive work environment • an exceptional patient/family experience
Advanced practice provider council	RNs	A forum for advanced practice nurses and other advanced practice providers to network, engage in educational offerings, and discuss: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • practice updates and trends • institutional changes • legislation • community events and outreach • research and evidence-based practice projects
Clinical nurse leadership council	RNs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An RN advisory committee that works directly with the chief nursing officer to address work environment and staffing issues exclusive to professional nursing practice
