Congratulations on your upcoming publication in *American Nurse Journal*! Now it's time to plan how you will promote the important information in your article and let others know of your accomplishment. Here are ways to do that.

Social media

- Post information (title, short description, and link) about your article on each of your social media accounts.* Keep the entries short and provide a link to your article on the *American Nurse Journal* website. Although some articles can be viewed only by *American Nurse Journal* subscribers, it's still important to share because many of your contacts will be able to access the article through databases at work or school. Remember to tag us (@myamericannurse) in your X posts so we can find and like or share your posts more easily.
- 2. Your article may be featured in *NurseLine*, our weekly e-newsletter. If you aren't currently receiving it, sign up at www.myamericannurse.com/nurseline-newsletter.
- 3. Consider connecting with *American Nurse Journal*'s social media platforms (see below) because we often feature articles such as yours that we have published. You can then share the entry with others in your network.

Connections and creative outlets

- 1. Share your accomplishment with your employer and the nursing school you graduated from; many of these contacts will publish the information in their newsletters or online.
- 2. Get creative. Create a short video of you talking about your work and post onlne. If you have a blog, write about your work.
