- Restricting mandatory overtime for nurses
- Nursing faculty Shortage Reduction Act (H.R. 7002, S 2815)
- Improving Care and Access to Nurses (ICAN) Act (S. 2418, H.R. 2713)
- Protect Timely Access to Quality Nursing Care in LTC facilities

These are just a few examples of how we can ignite change within our profession. I challenge you to get involved in your State and National Associations. We are grateful that you are members, and your dues are vital to the work. But just imagine how much more we can accomplish with your voice.
